New Job Vacancy Rushcliffe Befriends Project Co-ordinator 28 hours per week £22,443 - per annum, (pro rata)



This post is for a fixed term until 30th June 2016 but may be extended subject to funding.

A suitably experienced person is required to develop, maintain and coordinate our befriending project aimed at helping older people become less isolated and become more active in their community through a volunteer befriending programme. The post will involve the recruitment, training and support of volunteers, assessment of scheme users in their own homes and developing partnerships with a range of organisations.

The person appointed will have experience of working within voluntary or statutory organisations that serve the needs of older people. In addition they will have experience of, and be committed to, good practice in volunteer management. Excellent communication skills and strong organisational abilities are essential.

The post will be based in our West Bridgford office and extensive travel is a requirement of the post. Confirmation of appointment will be subject to a satisfactory Enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service check.

The Stroke Association has launched a new campaign to raise awareness of the FAST test, encourage more people to become FAST aware and highlight the importance of treating stroke and mini-stroke symptoms as a medical emergency and calling 999.

They want as many people as possible across the UK to know how to spot the signs of stroke or mini-stroke, and what action to take to ensure that patients arrive at a specialist stroke unit as quickly as possible. The Stroke FAST Forward webpage can be found here

The **FAST** test is:

- Facial weakness
- Arm weakness
- **Speech** problems
- Time to call 999
