## Volunteer Drivers Required – Rushcliffe and Gedling area

I love people and I love driving...

This winning combination has made one of our recent new volunteers for the Gedling Voluntary Transport Scheme, run from Rushcliffe CVS, perfect for the role. Do you know anyone in the Gedling or Rushcliffe area that fits this bill, with a bit of time on their hands?...please pass this information onto them.

Gedling Voluntary Transport Scheme and Rushcliffe Voluntary Transport Scheme are both looking for more voluntary drivers to take passengers to the doctors, to appointments, shopping, to social clubs and help them get out and about.

Volunteers use their own cars to take passengers out. Drivers need to have a car that is in good condition, MOT'd, insured and need to like helping people and talking to them. Drivers all have to undergo DBS (Disclosure and Barring Service) checks and provide 2 references. Passengers pay an annual registration fee and 45p/mile to cover the driver's costs. If you or anyone you know in the Gedling or Rushcliffe area is interested in becoming a volunteer driver, please get in touch or pass this information on.

## **EMAHSN** announce funding to support regional PPI groups

Community and voluntary groups that provide important platforms for patients to shape local health services could receive a funding boost from the East Midlands Academic Health Science Network(EMAHSN).

Following funding that was received by ten local Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) groups in 2015, EMAHSN have opened a new round of funding for a further ten groups which will total £1,500 per successful application. This is a vital contribution which can

contribute towards meeting running costs. The funding will support their fantastic work to promote innovations and the adoption and spread of best practice within patient, carer and public involvement in healthcare delivery and health research across the East Midlands.

EMAHSN launched the fund because it recognises that many voluntary groups find it difficult even to cover basic costs such as travel and members' out-of-pocket expenses. Many groups exist to make sure that experiences of patients and public are at the heart of future decisions about health services – something that is central to EMAHSN and that it wants to encourage and sustain.

Applications for the grants will be considered by the East Midlands PPI Senate, an independent expert group of patients and public with varied health service user experience. The senate supports health and social care organisations to embed patient engagement.

The deadline to apply for funding is **15 April 2016**.

Listening Books is a national charity that provides a postal and online audiobook library service to children and adults who struggle to read or hold a book due to an illness, disability, mental health issue or learning difficulty. A Safe Place is a place in the community where vulnerable people can get help if they are in distress. 9 out of 10 people with learning disabilities have experienced a hate incident

over the last year. This can affect their ability to access businesses and services in the community and lead a full life. The Safe Place Scheme provides Safe Places in the community where vulnerable people can go if they get into trouble. They may feel: unsafe, frightened, bullied, or have experienced name calling or violence.

How does the Safe Place Scheme work?

- Order your help pack for free

- Help people with a learning disability to call the police if needed
- If you know a person with a learning disability please get in touch and they will get them a Safe Place Card to use the scheme.

The free programme consists of seven, two hour weekly sessions, covering a different aspect of dementia at each session. The groups are facilitated by specialists in dementia group work and will consist of about 12 carers. Help with respite services and transport may be available.
