1. Apologies for Absence

Cllr David Barton, Cllr Pam Thompson, Cllr Keith Agar, Cllr Budworth and Cll Graham Leigh Browne - Approved.

2. Declaration of Interest

None received.

3. Chairman's Announcements

After the APM on Wednesday 18th April, the Chairman was approached by a Radcliffe Resident who reported two potholes in the pavement on the right hand side of Shelford Road up from Hamilton Drive. The Chairman asked the Clerk if she could report these potholes to the NCC on the resident's behalf.

4. Minutes of the Previous Meeting held on the 26th March 2018 for Approval

The Chairman noted three amendments to be made to the minutes at M.6: "Initial outline planning last year, be amended to "initial outline planning in 2013", "however there is now a new plan" be amended to "however there is now an outline planning application" and at M.10: "The ivy from the fencing will be removed next time to enable painting" be amended to "The last of the ivy from the fencing will be removed to enable the application of wood preservative to be completed." Resolved. "That the minutes subject to these amendments were approved and signed by the Chairman."

5. Clerks report on items arising from these minutes

There were no items arising from the previous minutes.

6. Open Session for members of the public to raise relevant matters, limited to 15 minutes

Standing Orders were suspended at 7.08pm

A member of the public stated that the dog fouling in the village continues to be a problem and asked the PC if any progress had been made and if the Dog Warden had visited the village. The Clerk confirmed that apart from stickers being placed around the village, there had been no further progress made, and although visits had been requested via the Dog Warden, there is only one person covering the whole of the Borough. The member of the public also asked if any further progress had been made regarding raising the level of the pavement outside the butchers to alight buses. The Clerk also confirmed a request has been made and will chase for a response.

Standing Orders resumed at 7.09pm

7. Recent Rushcliffe Borough Council Decisions as per the attached list Noted and discussed.

8. Planning Applications as per the attached list

Resolved: "The applications received were reviewed and the decisions taken as outlined on the attached document."

9. Subsequent Applications

Resolved: "Two subsequent applications received were reviewed and the decisions taken as outlined on the attached document."

10. Trains Working Group: Update

The Chairman has spoken to Cllr Thompson today, who has confirmed she had been in contact by email with various people in order to progress. Another Trains Working Group meeting is required, and the Chairman also confirmed that Companies have shown an interest in taking over the Franchise for East Midlands Trains. There has been a Newspaper report that one Company will be withdrawing from the bidding, although this has still yet to be confirmed. Four Companies originally bid for the franchise and the Trains Working Group has been lobbying on behalf of the PC to improve the number of trains stopping at Radcliffe, however there is nothing else to report at the current time. A member of the Trains Working Group confirmed that Network Rail has proposed funds for infrastructure improvements but they don't provide the service. The successful bidder for the Franchise should have been announced in April, however this will not now occur until after local elections due to the purdan period.

11. Planning Meetings – Latest Report and Future Representation (Meeting dates = 1775 & Others)

The next dates for the RBC Planning meetings are the 17th May and the 14th June. The Chairman noted that a number of Cllrs had attended previous meetings, to familiarise themselves how the meetings worked. It was questioned if the Cllrs should therefore continue to attend the meetings on a regular basis. The Chairman and Cllr Agar now looks at the agenda beforehand to see if any Radcliffe applications will be dealt with at the meeting, as most are just delegated to RBC Officers. It is hoped that eventually the outline planning application from William Davis will be dealt with at a meeting, however it is not listed this Thursday, so the earliest it can be listed is in May. If it does appear, the Chairman will attend the meeting if he is available. The Chairman will also keep Cllrs aware of RBC Planning meeting Agendas should any Radcliffe applications arise, in order for them to attend.

12. To Consider Date for another Litter Pick for BKVC

Noted and considered. It was agreed that the little pick should be arranged for Saturday 9th June 10-12, after the half term, when more volunteers would be available and to coincide with the judging for the 'Best Kept Village Competition'. Cllr Dunn will now put plans in place to organise volunteers for this date and informed the Clerk that litter picking equipment had been broken. It was however confirmed that an order for new equipment had been placed. Cllr Dunn also noted that 10 marks were awarded to Best Kept Village competitors for evidence of Community Involvement, and suggested that Radcliffe's Community Involvement is confirmed via the PC noticeboards also to include the Radeliffe Conservation Group.

13. Correspondence

There was no correspondence.

14. ___ Councillors Reports

Clir Clegg confirmed there is a Residents Association meeting tomorrow.

- Ellr Brears confirmed there is water running down from a drain outside 47 Cropwell Road to no 27
 Cropwell Road. STW have confirmed it is not their responsibility as it is a surface water issue. The Clerk
 confirmed that further enquiries will now be made with NCC to alleviate the problem.
- Residents have complained to Cllr Bailey concerning the unlawful firework display in the road outside the
 Grange gates last Thursday night. The Clerk provided the Cllrs with further details about the incident, and
 confirmed that the Fire Service had carried out an investigation and reported its findings to the Police.
 This issue however will be discussed in full detail at the next Grange and Grange Hall meeting.
