maintain our local green spaces. Dewberry Hill is managed by Radcliffe Parish Council
under a fifty year lease from Nottinghamshire County Council. If you're a regular user of

We suggest that you wear old clothes and sensible footwear, preferably boots as the ground can be quite damp and muddy in places during the winter. Bring along a decent pair of gardening gloves and maybe a pair of secateurs. Other tools will be provided.

We will be concentrating on the slope facing Cropwell Road. This is one of the areas we are trying to manage in order to encourage the re-growth of wildflowers on the site. Removal of patches of scrub, young saplings and bramble also help to keep the area open and maintain the quality of the view. We have already restored the bench up there earlier in the year.
