1. An Update presentation by Jermaine Shread, Positive Futures

Jermaine, and Becky of 'Positive Futures' and Max of YOUNG presented Cllrs with an overview and PowerPoint Presentation which included:

- J Positive Futures Sport Healthy Hearts Trial delivered to Radcliffe Junior School. Four Pupils achieved First Aid Certificates after the trial and both Primary and Secondary Schools will be targeted for trial in the future.
- J Positive Futures Sport Dodgeball Lunch Club delivered to 107 young people at Radcliffe Junior School.
- J Positive Futures Sport Boxercise P.E. delivered to 60 young people per half term at Radcliffe Junior School.
- J Positive Futures Sport 20 Health & Well Being Workshop sessions delivered to 5 young people at Radcliffe Junior School.
- J Positive Futures Sport Football ASC delivered to 30 young people at Radcliffe South Notts Academy.
- J Positive Futures Sport Dodgeball ASC delivered to 33 young people at Radcliffe South Notts Academy.
- J Positive Futures Sport Half Term: Currently offer sports for 94 young people over 9 sessions, 17 young people a football competition and 13 young people an Emirates Tour.
- J Positive Futures Involved in Community Events such as Radfest and Radcliffe Village Show. 200 young people involved at Radfest and 30 young people at the Village Show.
- J Positive Futures Mentoring Programme: delivered to 15 young people this year from referrals who are struggling with mental health issues, only weeks away from school exclusion.
- J Positive Futures Group Work and Educational Workshops: i.e. Knife Crime Workshop delivered to 35 young people across Rushcliffe, 8 young people from South Notts Academy with 1 member of Staff and a 2 day Cooking Workshop, delivered to 5 young people, 2 from SNA.
- J Positive Futures Summer Engagement Delivery Sessions: Activities delivered to Radcliffe and Rushcliffe young people over summer, i.e. Bowling, Cosmo meal, Jump Giants, Community Project Planning session, Residential ASDAN session, Cotgrave Youth Café, Alton Towers and residential trip to Frontier Centre.
- J 'Young' Project: Involves Work Experience Placements (3 traditional placements completed). Ambassadors (one Ambassador from SNA) School Support and Market: Radfest: 11 stall holders and markets in Rushcliffe.
- J 'Young' Project for the Future: To include 'snapshot' work experience, Radfest and other Young Markets, Ambassadors to have more of a presence in the Community and Social Media.

The PC Chairman thanked them for an excellent presentation and confirmed Cllrs had learnt a lot from the session and agreed the Positive Futures Team and YOUNG were carrying out a great job. The PC Chairman also confirmed the PC would help publicise the project.

2. Apologies for Absence

3. Declarations of Interest
There were no declarations of interest.
4. Minutes of the Full Council Meeting held on 30 September 2019 for Approval
Resolved: "That the minutes were approved as an accurate record and signed by the Chairman."
5. Chairman's Announcements
 - J There was a splendid turnout by the village for the Remembrance Parade and St Marys Church Service. It was an emotional day and the Chairman thanked RBC Cllr Neil Clarke and all the Marshalls who helped with the road closures. It was suggested that an article be placed on Social Media to thank all involved. It was noted that some cyclists ignored road closures in place and instead of the road, mounted their cycles on pathways amongst the crowds. This was disappointing and it was agreed that this needs to be addressed before the 2020 Parade.
 - J There has been a recent spate of vehicle break in's in Radcliffe and keyless cars have been targeted. The Chairman asked that people are vigilant to this and to keep their keys in a suitable pouch or tin, for this type of vehicle.
 - J The Chairman updated members on recent correspondence from the RBC in regard to the Totem Pole.
 - J The British Legion did not contact the PC this year regarding the display of Lamppost Poppies for the village. Lamppost Poppies were displayed in the village last year in commemoration of the end of WW1.

13. Reports from Borough and County Councillors

NCC Cllr Kay Cutts:

-) Had been to Worksop today where forty properties, including the Library and Bus Station had been flooded after the recent heavy rainfall. It was 2007 since the last floods, and Worksop residents can apply to the NCC for financial assistance via a newly set up 'Hardship Fund.'
-) Attended the Newton RAF Cadets 'Dining in Night', which was very good. This is a splendid organisation which is well equipped.
-) Attended the East Midlands Chambers Dinner. Various discussions included NCC support that over 75's should not pay for a TV Licence, County Lines, more Electrical Vehicle Charging points for the region, and repair and maintenance of Nottinghamshire roads. Any complaints relating to road conditions should be logged on the NCC website.
-) Unveiled a green communications box for the BT Openreach 'Fibre First' programme. Confirmed Upper Saxondale is an area that is well connected for broadband.
-) Went to the Bingham Town Civic Service Tea. At the tea it was confirmed that a new building is planned for Cotgrave Country Park to accommodate meetings and outdoor education for schoolchildren. Cllr Butler at Cotgrave PC is steering this project.
-) Attended the marvellous Remembrance Service yesterday in Radcliffe, which was very moving. The Village Parade was more of a village event and the outside service was lovely for those wanting to remember but did not wish to go to Church.
-) Was invited to an event for Nottingham Trent University at their new Hall used for concerts and it was very interesting.
-) A film has been made for foster parents who look after foster children. The foster parents do a magnificent job, who take children into their homes either for a small or long time until the children are ready to move on. There is still a duty of care for the children until the age of 25.
-) Has been invited to the Radcliffe Annual PC dinner this Saturday. It is a good idea to meet up with Cllrs at this social event other than business circumstances and NC Cllr Cutts thanked the PC Chairman for her invitation.

14. Councillors and Outside Organisations Reports

-) Cllr Tomlinson confirmed the Radcliffe Pre-School Play Group was recently mentioned in the Evening Post and had received a 'Good' Ofsted rating. The Pre-School is a Charity and need constant financial support. It is one of the Radcliffe Co-Op Charities and the Playgroup also carries out Social Work in the Community.
-) Cllr Deavin attended a Jeffrey Limmer Dole Trust meeting last Thursday. It is getting increasingly difficult to administer the Trust because of GDPR regulations, however it was stressed that money is available to people in the village who are in hardship or life crisis. Cllrs were requested to tell Cllr Deavin should they know of anybody in these circumstances.
-) Cllr McLeod confirmed there is a RBC Planning meeting this Thursday and will attend if there is anything on the agenda for Radcliffe
