# **The Armed Forces Covenant**

An Enduring Covenant Between

The People of the United Kingdom

Her Majesty's Government

– and –

All those who serve or have served in the Armed Forces of the Crown

And their Families

The first duty of Government is the defence of the realm. Our Armed Forces fulfil that responsibility on behalf of the Government, sacrificing some civilian freedoms, facing danger and, sometimes, suffering serious injury or death as a result of their duty. Families also play a vital role in supporting the operational effectiveness of our Armed Forces. In return, the whole nation has a moral obligation to the members of the Naval Service, the Army and the Royal Air Force, together with their families. They deserve our respect and support, and fair treatment.

Those who serve in the Armed Forces, whether Regular or Reserve, those who have served in the past, and their families, should face no disadvantage compared to other citizens in the provision of public and commercial services. Special consideration is appropriate in some cases, especially for those who have given most such as the injured and the bereaved.

This obligation involves the whole of society: it includes voluntary and charitable bodies, private organisations, and the actions of individuals in supporting the Armed Forces. Recognising those who have performed military duty unites the country and demonstrates the value of their contribution. This has no greater expression than in upholding this Covenant.

## Section 1: Principles of the Armed Forces Covenant

1.1 We **Radcliffe on Trent Parish Council** will endeavour in our business dealings to uphold the key principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, which are:

- *no member of the Armed Forces Community should face disadvantage in the provision of public and commercial services compared to any other citizen*
- *in some circumstances special treatment may be appropriate especially for the injured or bereaved.*

## Section 2: Demonstrating our Commitment

2.1 We recognise the value of serving personnel, reservists, veterans and military families; and will aim to uphold the principles of the Armed Forces Covenant, by:

- **Armed Forces Champion:** Identify an Armed Forces Champion who will engage with the Armed Forces Covenant Officers at Rushcliffe Borough Council to raise awareness and signpost the Armed Forces community when needing advice and guidance;
- **Promoting the Armed Forces:** promoting the fact that we are an Armed Forces-friendly Council, to our members and wider public; celebrating the work of the Armed Forces and encouraging positive interaction between them and members of the public;
- **Veterans:** Recognising that military veterans are a valued part of our community; facilitating and encouraging their participation in civic and community events; providing a link to the Veterans Gateway on our website
- **Service Spouses & Partners:** encouraging local businesses to support the employment of Service spouses and partners;
- **Reserves:** encouraging local businesses to support the employment of Reservists;
- **Cadet Organisations:** encouraging support of local military cadet units;
- **Armed Forces Events:** using the 'What's On' section of the Parish Council website to promote Armed Forces events such as local Breakfast Clubs, Coffee Mornings, Armed Forces Day, Reserves Day, the Poppy Appeal Day and Remembrance activities;
- **Armed Forces Charities:** encouraging support for Armed Forces charities;
- **Commercial Support:** encouraging local businesses to consider offering discounts to members of the Armed Forces community.

2.2 We will publicise these commitments through our literature, on staff notices, and on our website, setting out how we will seek to honour them and inviting feedback from the Service community and our customers on how we are doing.

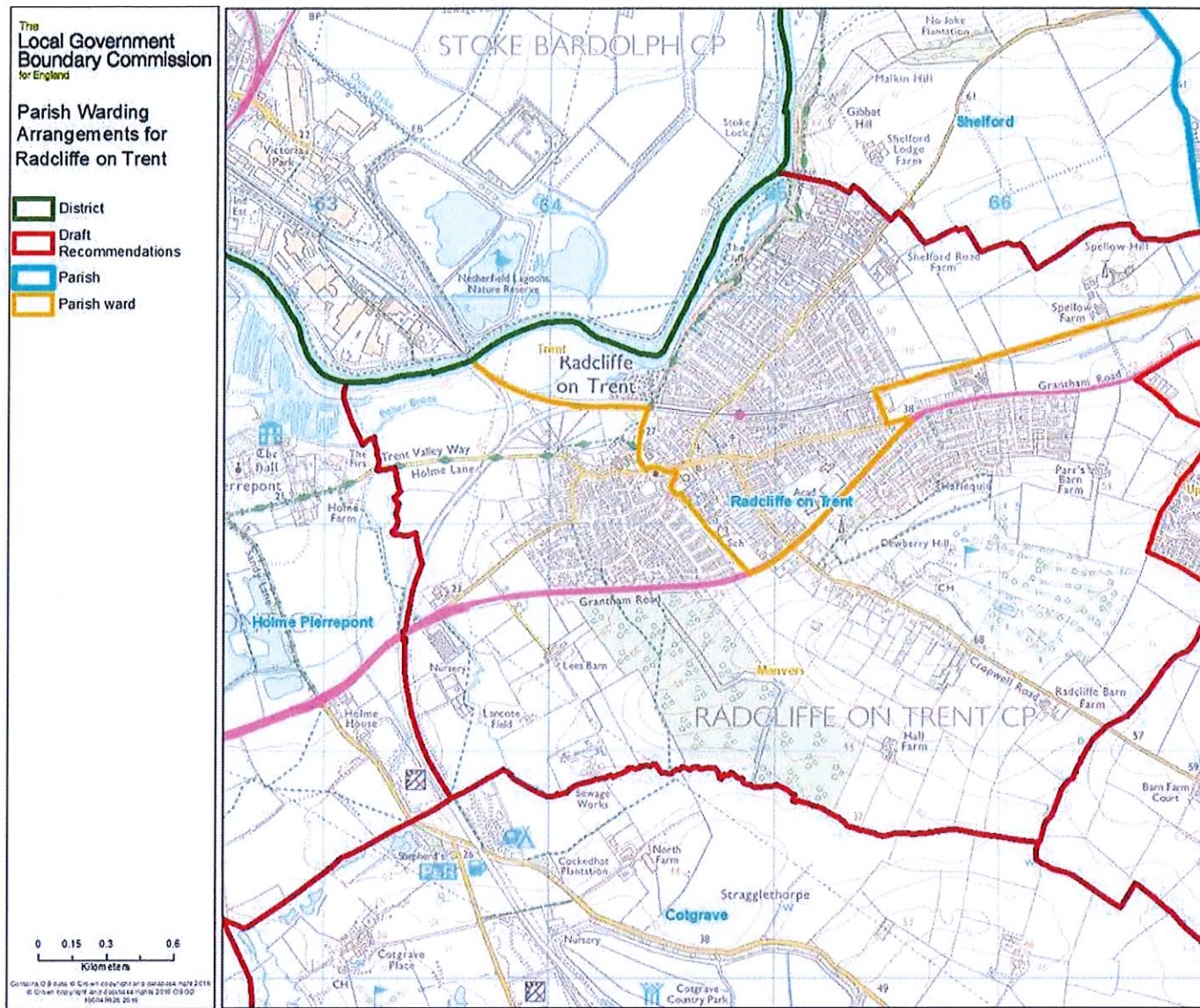

**ELECTORAL REVIEW OF RUSHCLIFFE BOROUGH COUNCIL: DRAFT  
RECOMMENDATIONS**

The Local Government Boundary Commission for England has published proposals for new electoral arrangements for Rushcliffe. A summary is attached.

The electoral arrangements for your parish or town council may change because of our proposals. Please find attached a map outlining the proposed electoral arrangements for your council.

We propose that 44 councillors should be elected to Rushcliffe in future. We also propose new ward boundaries across the authority.



A public consultation on the proposals will run from 5 October 2021 to 13 December 2021.

Once we have considered all responses to the consultation, we aim to publish final recommendations in March 2022. We will then lay a draft order in both houses of Parliament. Subject to parliamentary scrutiny, the new electoral arrangements are scheduled to come into effect at the authority’s elections in 2023.

We considered all representations received from local people and organisations during our initial consultation when drawing up our proposals. We have sought to balance statutory criteria we must follow when drawing up these proposals, and we seek to:

- Make sure that, within an authority, each councillor represents a similar number of electors
- Create boundaries that are appropriate, and reflect community ties and identities
- Deliver reviews informed by local needs, views and circumstances

We are now inviting comments on the proposals before we finalise the new electoral arrangements in your area. We will consider every response we receive during the consultation period and will weigh each response against the criteria above.



## Have your say

We are now consulting local people on a new pattern of wards for Rushcliffe Borough Council. We have an open mind about our final recommendations, and we will consider every piece of evidence we receive from local groups and people, regardless of whom it is from or whether it relates to the whole council area or just a part of it. If you agree with our recommendations, please let us know. If you don't think our recommendations are right for Rushcliffe we want to hear alternative proposals for a different pattern of wards.

We aim to propose a pattern of wards for Rushcliffe Borough Council which delivers:

- **Electoral equality:** each councillor represents a similar number of electors.
- **Community identity:** reflects the identity and interests of local communities.
- **Effective and convenient local government:** helping your council discharge its responsibilities effectively.

### A good pattern of wards should:

- Provide good electoral equality, with each councillor representing, as closely as possible, the same number of electors.
- Reflect community interests and identities and include evidence of community links.
- Be based on strong, easily identifiable boundaries.
- Help the council deliver effective and convenient local government.

### Electoral equality

- Does your proposal mean that councillors would represent roughly the same number of electors as elsewhere in the council area?

### Community identity

- **Transport links:** are there good links across your proposed ward? Is there any form of public transport?
- **Community groups:** is there a parish council, residents association or another group that represents the area?
- **Facilities:** does your pattern of wards reflect where local people go for shops, medical services, leisure facilities etc?

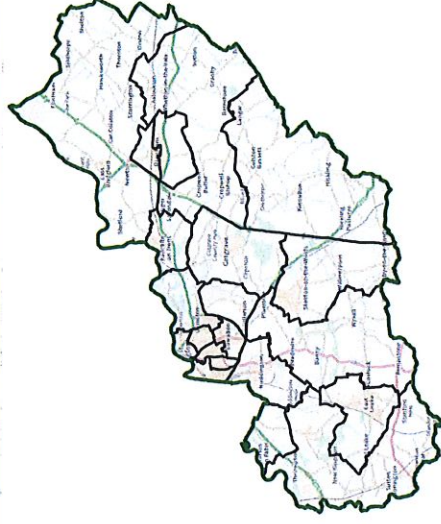

## Draft Recommendations on the new electoral arrangements



### Who we are

- The Local Government Boundary Commission for England is an independent body set up by Parliament.
- We are not part of government or any political party.
- We are accountable to Parliament through a committee of MPs chaired by the Speaker of the House of Commons.
- Our main role is to carry out electoral reviews of local authorities throughout England.

### Electoral review

An electoral review examines and proposes new electoral arrangements for a local authority, including:

- The total number of councillors representing the council's electors ('council size').
- The names, number and boundaries of wards or electoral divisions.
- The number of councillors for each ward or division.

### Why Rushcliffe?

- Rushcliffe Borough Council currently has high levels of electoral inequality: some councillors represent many more - or many fewer - electors than others.
- Therefore the value of your vote, in Rushcliffe Borough Council elections, varies depending on where you live in Rushcliffe.
- We are seeking to improve levels of electoral equality for local electors

### Our proposals

- We propose that the council should have **44** councillors in future, representing five three-councillor wards, nine two-councillor wards, and seven single-councillor wards across the council area.

**You have until 13 December 2021 to have your say on the recommendations**



## Summary of our recommendations

Our draft recommendations propose that Rushcliffe Borough Council should have 44 councillors, the same as existing arrangements.

Those councillors should represent five three-councillor wards, nine two-councillor wards, and seven single councillor wards across the council area.

Before drawing up the draft recommendations, the Commission carried out a public consultation inviting proposals for a new pattern of wards for Rushcliffe.

We have considered all of the submissions we received during that phase of consultation. The boundaries of most wards should change.

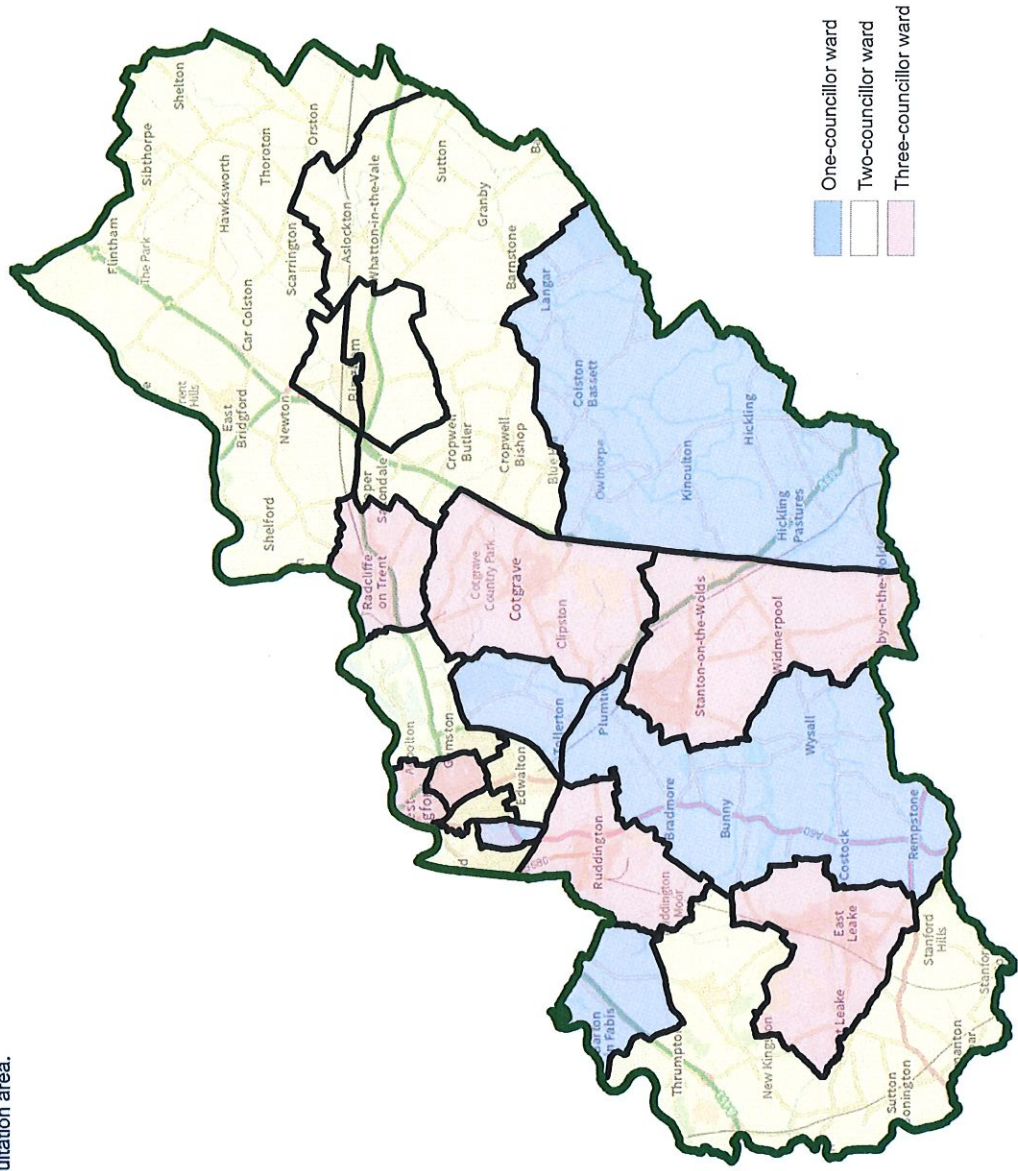

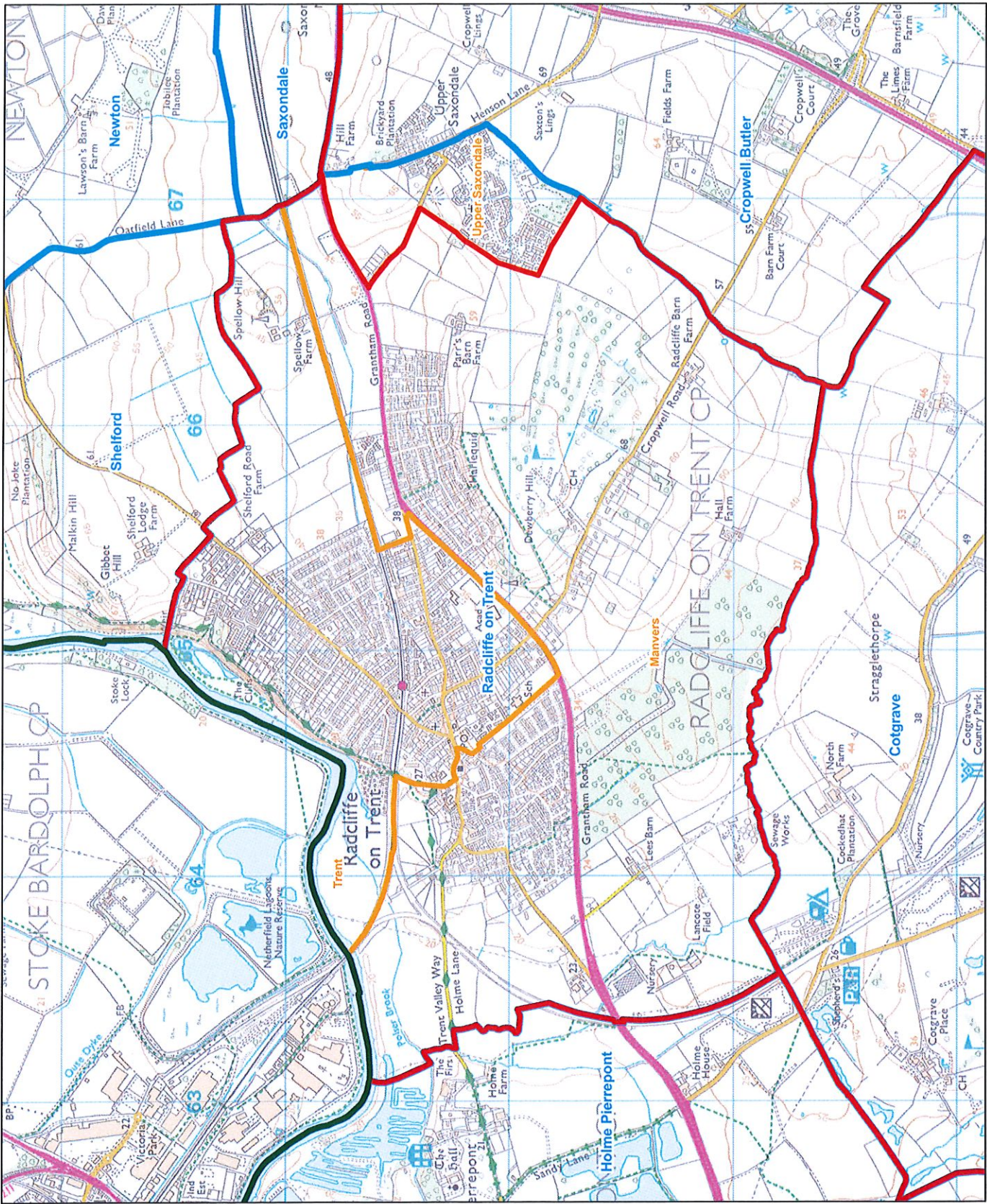

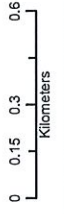
