# We've secured £25,000 funding to clear chewing gum hot spots



We've received a £25,000 grant from the Chewing Gum Task Force, administered by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy, to further help clean up gum and reduce gum littering across the Borough with an initial focus on larger towns and villages.

Further plans are in place to remove the gum that blights local streets in Bingham, Cotgrave, East Leake, Keyworth, Ruddington, Radcliffe on Trent and West Bridgford.

The funding has enabled the our Streetwise team to extend their work to prevent the issue, purchasing three fully electric gum removal machines that will safely remove chewing gum whilst being kinder to the environment.

We are one of 56 across the country that have successfully applied to the Chewing Gum Task Force, now in its second year, for funds to clean gum off pavements and prevent it from being littered again.

Established by Defra and run by environmental charity Keep Britain Tidy, the Chewing Gum Task Force Grant Scheme is open to councils across the UK who wish to clean up gum in their local areas and invest in long-term behaviour change to prevent gum from being dropped in the first place.

# Green Memory Café successfully launched at Rushcliffe Country Park



The first Memory Café at Rushcliffe Country Park took place on Wednesday June 21 for people living with memory loss and their carers.

The free session was well attended and saw a range of nature-based activities including a nature walk and leaf pressing using natural materials found at the park.

We worked in partnership with Rushcliffe Dementia Project and Rushcliffe Primary Care Network to deliver the sessions.

A 'Dementia Directory' of support for people with dementia is available on the <u>Rushcliffe PCN website</u> which provides a one-stop-shop for dementia support and advice.

#### Latest round of Community Ownership Fund now open



The Community Ownership Fund has launched to help communities and groups nationwide take ownership of assets at risk of closure.

Since July 2021, community groups have been able to bid for up to £250,000 matched funding to help them buy or take over local community assets at risk of being lost, to run as community-owned businesses.

A summary of the key changes to the eligibility requirements for the relaunch of the Fund include:

- Reducing the match funding requirement; where previously the Community Ownership Fund would contribute up to 50% of total capital funds required, it will now contribute up to 80% of the total capital funds required, with applicants required to raise the other 20% from other sources of funding. Projects in areas of the greatest need will only need to raise 10%, as determined by the fund's Development Support provider;
- Increasing the amount of funding all projects can bid for from £250k to £1m and;
- Allowing parish councils (and their equivalent town and community councils) to apply in the same way that community groups do now.

These changes will be coupled with support from the fund's <u>Development Support</u> <u>provider</u>, who will be onboard and offering the full scope of their support from Round 3 onwards.
