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		that the Mainline and villager services were currently experiencing, this included: Recruitment and retainment issues – post-covid many drivers were enticed, with a golden handshake, to join transport companies. Some of those drivers were now returning. These are currently 15 vacancies at the Nottingham depot and he training school is full. Vehicles on the Mainline service are approx. 5 years with many spare parts coming from abroad, taking weeks or months to arrive. There have been many issues with the traffic lights at the top of Bingham Road with several near misses. Letters of complaint have been sent to National Highways. The Rushcliffe Villager vehicle is no longer in production and parts are		

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		very difficult to obtain. There are only 2 branded buses on this route and breakdowns are high. • There are issues with bad or poor parking on Clumber Drive, sometimes leading to this part of the journey being missed out as the bus cannot get through. • The Village service is not commercially viable. 2. Defibrillators: the secretary has produced a list of defibrillators within the village and intends to display the list in prominent places in the village, once the list is confirmed as correct and up to date. 3. Mention of River Trent sewage contamination was made, this is in the area close to the Park Homes site, is the PC aware of this? Cllr Clegg and Clerk attended the NALC AGM.
